UPDATES FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It is the time of year when the temperature and leaves start dropping and we say goodbye to the summer of 2016. One of the highlights of the summer was our 35th year of Polish Fest. It is with the hard work and dedication of the many volunteers that we were able to put on this 3-day event to over 35,000 fest goers and a media out reach of over 1.2 million people to promote understanding and appreciation of our Polish heritage. I am happy to report that Polish Fest made a substantial profit to help support our mission and keep our Polish Center alive. I am thankful and proud of all of the volunteers, chair persons, managing committee members, financial supporters and attendees that helped support Polish Fest 2016 and make this event happen. I have included in this newsletter a list of sponsors that help with support to Polish Fest; please help by showing our thanks and patronizing their companies.

In regard to the Polish Center, I am also happy to report that I have been able to reduce our electric and gas bill by 40% or more by the implementation of cost saving ideas. An example of this is that I have worked with the heating and air conditioning contractor to correctly adjust our air handler that was working excessively and inefficiently for the past few years. By making adjustments in the controls, and a number of damper repairs, we are able to see a great reduction in the bills. I am continuing my efforts to look at all areas and find the best practices for

efficiency and betterment of the Polish Center. I have been working with the Facility Committee to come up with a prioritized schedule for repairs to our Center and schedule them. With the recent increase in banquet bookings (that we are happy to have) it is a challenge to try and schedule the repairs without a disruption in our banquets and events. Some of the repairs such as the wood floor repair and refinishing will be pushed out into 2017. We still are working on the necessary repairs to some of the doors, windows, and gutters to be done by the end of the year.

We are always trying to come up with new ways to encourage participation for our members. Please join us for some of upcoming events. By being a member, you will find reduced prices to some of events and cultural workshops, thanks in part to donations and sponsorships. We have had a couple of member socials which seem to be growing in popularity. The next one is scheduled for Tuesday, December 20. It is a great time visit the Center and meet fellow members or bring new people to join. This is your organization, please come and take part in the many events throughout the year. If you have any ideas to share, please feel free to let me know.

FACILITY COMMITTEE

The Facility Committee has developed a long-term maintenance, improvement and repair plan for the Polish Center. Recent accomplishments include completion of a survey of the property by Chaput Land Surveys LLC and obtaining approval and funding from the Board for gardening and landscaping, second floor window repairs and rain gutter installation, replacement of various exterior doors, sanding and refinishing the first floor wooden floors and conversion from incandescent to LED lights throughout the Center.

We will be installing brass foot rails for the bar and are in the process of looking

at replacement carpeting. In addition, we are reviewing chairs, both stackable and non-stackable, many of which are tattered, soiled and outdated. We are also exploring the possibility of adding a gazebo in front of the building near the pond, and possibly in the back, as well as developing plans for the boathouse and improving exterior parking lot lighting, to include replacement of the existing fixtures.

Finally, we are continuing to monitor the condition of the parking lot and anticipate replacement and possible expansion within the next two to three years, at a cost ranging from \$180,000

to \$240,000. This could be accelerated. The short-term plan for the parking lot is to patch and repair as necessary.

As is the case with other committees, we are looking for people who might be interested in serving on the Facility Committee or one of its two subcommittees: the Aesthetics and Décor Subcommittee and the Garden and Landscape Subcommittee. We are also particularly interested in attracting volunteers to help improve the outside appearance of our building and grounds.

THE GRAND REOPENING OF THE CLUB 38

This past November 2015, the Polish Center Gala was a recreation of a cabaret in a Pre-World War II Warsaw nightclub - the Club 38. Attendees enjoyed cocktails, appetizers, a silent auction, a wine pull, a fine four course dinner, music of the John Schneider Orchestra, and dancing. It was a wonderful fun-filled evening.

For the 2016 Gala, to be held on November 5th, we will fast-forward two decades to the Autumn of 1958. The tragedy of the heroic Warsaw Uprising in August and September 1944 to free Warsaw from the grip of the occupying Nazi forces ended on October 2nd. With that, Hitler ordered the complete destruction of Warsaw. By the time the Nazis departed in defeat by the Russian army in January 1945, 85% of the city was in ruins. The Club 38 was no more.

Henryk Lewandowski, the founder and owner, fortunately survived. John Schneider and the members of his orchestra survived as well, thanks to being in Finland during the Uprising. Henryk was able to reopen the club in November 1958 in a new location on Poznanska Street between Wilcza and Hoza. Only a few blocks away from the original location on Marszalkowska Street. During the construction of the

new Club 38, Henryk found a statue of the Warsaw Mermaid (Warszawska Syrenka) in the rubble, intact and in superb condition. The Mermaid is now on permanent display in the Club. Having your picture taken with her would make a fine memento of your attendance.



The club is now very popular with the citizens of Warsaw. Maybe the decor is not quite as opulent, as these are the days of Communist suppression and a miserable economy, but the food is great - thanks to former friends of Henryk - and the music is better than ever. If for no

other reason, Porter, Berlin, Carmichael, and Arlen composed a lot of new music after the war.

November 5, 2016 is a date to be saved. Join your fellow revelers at the new Club 38 for another fun-filled evening. The Gala Committee's plan is to again feature cocktails, appetizers, a silent auction, a fabulous four course dinner, the John Schneider orchestra and dancing.

The Gala is the Polish Center's major fundraiser of the year. The 2015 Gala raised over \$13,000 which helped free us from the mortgage on our property and building. Ticket prices alone did not earn this amount of money. Generous donations by members, friends, and local businesses contributed to our success. As our building ages, more maintenance and replacements are necessary. New doors and window frames, floor refinishing, painting, and a newly paved parking lot are items that require funds. The success of our Gala will help get this accomplished.

You should have received an invitation for the 2016 Gala by now. The Gala Committee, the Board of Directors, and the Polish Center Team Members are counting on seeing you there.

FLAGPOLE AREA:

We planted double red knockout roses by the area by the flags. The white potentilla bushes blend beautifully with them. Red Hardy Hibiscuses are behind the potentilla.

SPRING COLOR:

Hanging baskets with a red and white theme, along with the Weeping Cherry trees. Assorted bulbs were ordered for the front areas.

Patio Garden is a two year project with the focal point being the fountain.



2017 COLLEGE ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

POLANKI'S annual College Achievement Awards recognize students who have demonstrated high achievement and who are committed to understanding, preserving, or disseminating Polish culture and or language.

Criteria: 1. U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident

2. Junior, senior or graduate status during the 2016-17 academic year in an accredited degree program
3. Wisconsin resident OR attending a Wisconsin college or university
4. Of Polish ancestry OR have studied Polish language, history, society, or culture OR significantly engaged in Polish culture
5. Minimum 3.0 GPA on a four-point scale preferred
6. Applicants are limited to no more than two awards in their academic career. Past recipients may re-apply: (1) as a graduate student if they previously received an award as an undergraduate
(2) if they completed the course of study for which they previously received an award and are pursuing a new degree in another accredited degree program

Awards: The following awards may be offered in amounts ranging from \$750 to \$2000

- **Stanley F. and Helen Balcerzak Award** for an outstanding student in any field
- **Copernicus Award** for an outstanding student in a science field
- **Robert J. Leonard Memorial Award** for a student engaged in dance or theater
- **Harriet Gostomski Memorial Award** for a UW-Milwaukee student
- **Michael and Maria Laskowski Memorial Award** for a graduate student or a senior intending to attend graduate school at Marquette University (excluding the schools of dentistry and law). Marquette University matches the award with a tuition waiver.
- **George Niemczycki Memorial Award and other specially-funded memorial awards** for students in any field

PLEASE NOTE: All applicants will automatically be considered for all awards for which they meet the qualifications.

Application Instructions:

1. Complete Part 1 (see next page) by printing legibly using a black ink pen or typing on the application form.
2. Complete Parts 2-4 in English, typed, and submitted on separate pages attached to the form. Please include your name on each page.
3. Attach one college-issued transcript for each college attended (unofficial transcripts are acceptable).
Alverno College applicants: please request a class rank or some standard of your academic performance relative to that of other students.
4. Send your materials to: **Polanki College Achievement Award, PO Box 341458, Milwaukee, WI 53234**
5. Applications must be **postmarked no later than January 20, 2017**. Only complete applications will be considered.
6. Awards will be presented at the annual Polanki College Achievement Awards Tea on **Sunday, April 23, 2017 at 2 pm** at the Polish Center of Wisconsin, 6941 South 68th Street, Franklin, WI 53132. Awardees are expected to attend the Awards Tea to receive their award and, as part of the acceptance, to make a brief (1-2 minute) presentation about their academic background and their interest in Polish Culture.
